1. INTRODUCTION OF THE COLLEGE

Mokokchung College of Teacher Education was established by the Government of Nagaland (Department of Higher Education) at Yimyu, Mokokchung, Nagaland. It was originally founded in 2011 as Mokokchung B.Ed College and start the first academic session in the year 2012, as the 2nd Government College of Teacher Education.

The College was officially inaugurated on 20th February and start functioning in a borrowed infrastructure belongs to DIET-Mokokchung. MCTE Permanent Administrative Building was inaugurated on 12th December 2014 and the Academic Session of 2 years B.Ed. programme start functioning in the new building from 1st July 2015

The main objective of the College is to bring quality Teacher Education for Secondary and Higher Secondary Teachers from Mokokchung, Longleng, Zunheboto, Mon and Tuensang. With the objective, the college is preparing and equipping the teacher trainees from 5 (five) districts of the state to be more competent, dedicated and committed human facilitators of learning while at the same time promoting research, providing extension service and leadership in educational system.

2. ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

Nagaland University introduced the semester system in the Teacher Education Course (B.Ed.) from the academic session of 2012 and it is noteworthy to highlight here that the pass percentage of the 3rd batch (i.e. 2014) of the College was 98.65% which was the 1st in rank amongst the College of Teacher Education in the State. Out of 74 total candidates of B.Ed. students, 73 students cleared both

semester exam in 2014 and out of 73 cleared candidates, 66 students got 1st division and 7 candidates was placed in 2nd Division.

3. DEVELOPMENT ACHIEVEMENT (Construction and other relate matters)

- (a) In 2015, 4 (four) important rooms of the college (i.e., Principal's office, Vice Principal's office, Head Assistant's office and Tools room) were covered with iron grilles for security reason. The construction was made under RUSA programme.

(c) Development works under Horticulture.

Under RUSA programme, the college initiated to introduce Horticulture as vocational course of study to be incorporated in the B.Ed. course. Accordingly the college prepared a syllabus in collaboration with horticulture department and submitted to Nagaland University for approval, which was recently approved by the University Authority. Through this achievement the said course of study will enable the teacher trainees in the state to gain the basic knowledge of modern technology in the field of horticulture which is different from our traditional method. The same vocational course of study approved by Nagaland University can be used not only for professional institutions but also applicable to other general colleges in the state affiliated to Nagaland University.

(d) Construction of MCTE Canteen

The college canteen, an area of 600 sq.feet (40 x15 ft) was constructed with the retrieved materials, collected from 2 (two) acquired houses (dismantled for future development of the college) and college internal fund.

4. ACTIVITIES & DEVELOPMENT UNDER RUSA.

Under RUSA programme, the college received an amount of ₹10,71,562.50 (Rupees ten lakhs seventy one thousand five hundred sixty two and fifty paise) only as 1st instalment for infrastructure development. Out of the received amount the college spent for construction of 2 (two) protection walls, floor carpeting, covered 4 (four) rooms with iron grille for security and 1 (one) play court (incomplete).

The college monitoring cell (RUSA-MCTE) along with the staff, students and labourers engaged in clearing jungles, prepared nursery bed to plant palm seeds, transferring the sprout seeds into poly bags, pit digging in different blocks, plantations of palm (sūrah) saplings. For production of fruits, planted mangoes, guava, coconuts, litchi, mosambi, etc. The college is also maintaining other inherited fruits which were planted before land acquisition by the land owners.

5. ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS UNDER NAAC

The college constituted Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) to work for NAAC assessment, preparing Self Study Report (SSR) for submission to NAAC, Bangalore. However, the college is still at its nascent stage, which was established and start functioning with effect from 2012. The college is only in its fourth year, which is not qualify to be assessed by NAAC visiting team.

The college Principal and IQAC coordination went to attend seminars from time to time organized by Higher Education Department, Nagaland. At the same time conduct 1 (one) day workshop in the college, to create awareness among the IQAC members, faculty and staff for NAAC Assessment and learned about the duties and responsibilities.

The IQAC members decided to conduct another 1 (one) day workshop in the first part of February 2016 and already engaged Dr. I. Wati Imchen- Coordinator, IQAC of Fazl Ali College, Mokokchung to come and re-orient the MCTE faculty, staff and all members of IQAC for final preparation on Self Study Report.

6. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- I. The college has organized cultural day on 1st August 2015 at its Conference Hall with a view to preserve and transmit our cultural wealth. The teacher trainees participated in presenting folk song, play on “The Complicated Love Life Disgusted For Her Boyfriend” and couple show with their traditional dress were among the celebration.



- II. On 14th August 2015 the college organized Club Activities Day and the event was marked by painting competition, extempore speech, debate and quiz competition.



- III. Along with the rest of the world the college observed International Literary Day 2015 on 8th September. During the observation the teacher trainees participated in poetry writing competition, elocution, solo and stand up comedian act were the significance of the day.
- IV. Along with the rest of the institutions throughout the country, the Mokokchung College of Teacher Education (MCTE), Mokokchung on 26th Nov. 2015 organized a seminar under the theme “Constitution Day” in commemoration of 125th Birth Anniversary of Bharat Ratna, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar at MCTE Conference Hall. The resource person for this seminar, Dr. Rijingkhum Yimchunger, Assistant Professor, MCTE, gave a brief historical background of the preamble of our Constitution and highlighted the significance of our Constitution. All the participants read together the Preamble of our Constitution.
- V. To curb the menace of ragging in Higher Education Institutions and to spread awareness on anti-ragging institutions, the anti-ragging cell of MCTE, Mokokchung organized an anti-ragging posters and slogan campaign on 16th Nov. 2015. Various anti-ragging posters and

slogans were displayed in an around the vicinity of the college and necessary information were provided on anti-ragging.

- VI. The MCTE Mokokchung observed a sanitation drive on 7th Nov. 2015 as ‘Cleanliness Drive in Education Sector’ under Swaach Bharat Mission Drive. The MCTE staffs along with the trainees joined hands for the cleanliness drive in the college. REPORT ON STUDENTS ENROLMENT FOR 2015-16

Mokokchung College of Teacher Education, Yimyu-Mokokchung, Nagaland was established in 2012 to impart Teacher Education (B.Ed.). The professional course of B.Ed. programme is for 1 (one) year till 2014. From 2015, introduced 2 (two) years course for all Teacher Education Institutions in the country. The 2 (two) years B.Ed. programme break up into 4 (four) semesters and the academic session start from July every year.

The intake capacity is 100 candidates for every academic session. However the college could not get requisite number of candidates (deputationists) from School Education Department. In 2015 only 77 registered for 2 (two) years B.Ed. programme.
